PRESENTATION OF BAPTISMAL CANDIDATE

The one being welcomed and her sponsor gather with the pastor and assisting minister in front of the assembly. The presiding minister addresses the assembly.

P Dear friends, we gather today with this candidate who has been called by God's Spirit to seek Holy Baptism. Together, let us welcome her to this community of faith in Jesus Christ.

Her sponsor presents the baptismal candidate.

S I present Claire Johnson who is preparing for baptism.

The presiding minister asks the candidate presented:

- P What do you ask of God's church?
- C To hear God's word with you.

- P What do you seek from God's word?
- C Faith and fullness of life.

The presiding minister continues:

- P Grace and mercy are given to all who call upon God's name. Will you be faithful in learning the way of Christ?
- C I will, and I ask God to help me.

The presiding minister addresses the sponsor and the assembly.

- P People of God, will you help Claire to hear the gospel of Jesus Christ within this household of faith?

SIGN OF THE CROSS

The presiding minister addresses the one being welcomed.

P You have heard the holy and saving gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. Now receive the sign of that gospel on your body and in your heart, that you may know the Lord and the power of his resurrection.

A sponsor for the person being welcomed traces a cross on the person's forehead as the presiding minister says:

- P Receive the + sign of the cross, a sign of God's endless love and mercy for you.
- C Praise to you, O Christ, the wisdom and power of God.

The assisting minister presents a Bible to the person being welcomed. These or similar words may be spoken.

A Receive this Bible.

Hear God's word with us.

Learn and tell its stories.

Discover its mysteries.

Honor its commandments.

Rejoice in its good news.

May God's life-giving word inspire you and make you wise.

The one preparing for baptism may kneel. The presiding minister may extend both hands over her or may lay a hand on her head during the prayer.

P Let us pray.

Merciful God, creator and giver of life, you have called all people from darkness into light, from error into truth, from death into life. Grant grace to Claire and bless her. Raise her by your Spirit. Revive her by your word. Form her by your hand. Bring her to the water of life and to the bread and cup of blessing, that with all your people she may bear witness to your grace and praise you forever through Jesus Christ our Lord.

C Amen.

The pastor addresses Claire.

- P God bring you in peace and joy to fullness of life in Christ in the waters of baptism.
- C May the God of all grace, who has called you to glory, support you and make you strong.



PRAYER OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION (for our Livestream viewers)


A spiritual communion is a personal devotion that anyone can pray at any time to express their desire to receive Holy Communion at that moment, but in which circumstances impede them from actually receiving Holy Communion. As Martin Luther once wrote: "I can enjoy the sacrament ... every day if only I keep my eyes on the promise, that is, on the words and promise of Christ, which feeds and strengthens my faith."

As we distribute Holy Communion to the congregation here, we invite those on the livestream to offer the Prayer of Spiritual Communion displayed on your screen:


Church Work Day - This Saturday, March 23, 8:30 a.m. - 12:00 Noon
