1. Thank you for the continuing education time granted me last month to attend the annual Liturgical Conference at Valparaiso University, Valparaiso, IN. The conference theme this year was: Baptism and gathered almost 300 pastors, deacons, musicians, seminary and university professors and students. I found the plenary lectures and workshops to be very helpful and engaging. Following the conference, I was able to visit with my nephew and his wife in Chicago prior to my return to Camarillo.
2. Pastoral Ministry: (combined report for March/April) 18 worship services, 5 pastoral counseling, 8 Confirmation classes, 4 Men’s Bible study, 5 Wednesday Bible studies, 6 Sunday Bible studies, 2 Pastoral Installations at Ascension, Thousand Oaks and Shepherd of the Valley, Simi Valley, 1 Conference Collegium, 2 meetings at CLU.
3. The newly-elected Dean of our Channel Islands Conference is Pastor Jennifer Chrien of Shepherd of the Valley, Simi Valley. Pastor Chrien will serve a 3-year term as our Dean.
4. Worship & Music committee has reviewed our worship services for Holy Week & Easter. The revised liturgies for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil were appreciated and provided new options for our worshippers. Again, I express my thanks to the many Mount Cross

members whose efforts, participation and leadership made our Easter worship opportunities so vibrant.

5. Our MET team is moving forward with their assignments. Tomorrow evening is the final opportunity for anyone to complete a Congregational Vitality survey. Chair Susan Prosser will provide a detailed report to Council, but I want to express my thanks to this committee for their fine work in completing the survey in such a comprehensive way. 1. Thank you again for graciously welcoming me into your midst. We are one month into the Interim and things are settling down. Full staff meetings have been a challenge due to travel and illness. We’re getting things done on the run.
2. Pastoral Ministry: 8 worship services, 1 memorial service (Donna Hollingsworth), 3 pastoral counseling, 4 Confirmation classes, 1 Men’s Bible study, 4 Wednesday Bible studies, 3 Sunday Bible studies, Annual Meeting, and Interim Pastor’s meeting with the Bishop.
3. Interim Pastors in our Southwest California Synod meet three times a year with Bishop Erwin. Last week’s meeting had some information I want to share with you.
 - a. With declining congregation numbers and anxieties that face our congregations there are new challenges for Interim Ministry.
 - b. 50% of our 115 congregations may not exist in a decade.

- c. There are twice as many Uber drivers as there are Lutheran in So. California. There are twice as many homeless. We are a small tribe.
 - d. There is anxiety from the fear of failure. Interim Pastors can help the congregation understand their own narrative.
 - e. 10% of our congregations are fully functional.
 - f. Ministry Evaluation Team (MET) documents are being revised. We will use the most current forms for our Mt. Cross process.
4. Ash Wednesday worship is February 14, 7:00 p.m. here at Mount Cross. Our guests will be parishioners from St. Columba's. I hope you can be with us.
