The group meets the second Friday of every month from 1-3 pm in the Parish Life Center to knit together. All skill levels are welcome - we will teach you all you need to know!

Directions for knitting:

Materials: 3 skeins Lion Brand Homespun yarn
Size 11 or 13 knitting needles
Begin with a prayer of blessing for the shawl,
and continue to weave prayers into the shawl
as you knit.

Cast on 57 stitches. Straight knit until the shawl is about 5 feet long. Knit about 2 + 2/3 skeins in the shawl. Use the rest of the yarn for 3-9 inches of fringe.

*Alternative pattern for knitting: Cast on 57 stitches. First Row: k3, p3, to end. Next row: same. Always start the next row with the opposite stitch of what you see. Knit the purls and purl the knits. Note: If you cast on 57 stitches you will always start with K3.

Directions for crocheting:

Materials: 3 skeins Lion Brand Homespun yarn Crochet hook size N or 9

Begin with a prayer of blessing for the shawl, and continue to weave prayers into the shawl as you crochet.

Chain 59. Double crochet (dc) in 3rd chain from hook. Dc in each chain across (58 stitches). Chain 2, turn, dc in first dc. Dc across. Repeat until shawl is about 5 feet long. Add 4-6 inch fringe across both ends of shawl.



In 1998, Janet Bristow and Victoria Galo, with a simple idea, gave birth to a ministry. Compassion and the love of knitting/crocheting have been combined into a prayerful ministry and spiritual practice which reaches out to those in need of comfort and solace, as well as in celebration and joy. Many blessings are prayed into every stitch.

The shawl maker begins with prayers and blessings for the recipient. The intentions are continued throughout the creation of the shawl. Upon completion, a final blessing is offered before the shawl is sent on its way.

Shawls are always given away, never sold. They are passed to someone who needs one at the discretion of the pastors. If you know of a need, please share it with Pastor John or Pastor Erik.
